I wish, first of all, to thank Rt. Hon. Donatile Mukabalisa, the Speaker of the Parliament of Rwanda and indeed, the entire Government of the Republic of Rwanda for accepting to host EALA for the duration of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Meeting of the 4<sup>th</sup> Session of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Assembly.

I congratulate Rt. Hon Mukabalisa for leading the Chamber of Deputies with dedication and charisma since assuming the position of Speaker of the Chamber of Deputies in 2013.

The relations between Parliament of Rwanda and EALA are cordial. That very gesture of surrendering the use of the precincts of Parliament to EALA over the two week period portends a strong statement of cordiality and one of pure friendship. I am confident that under your leadership, the Parliament of Rwanda shall make significant achievements and that its role as the Legislature, Oversight and Representative body shall continue to be strengthened. I can vouch that with you as the Presiding Officer of the House, we shall see far reaching reforms aimed at enhancing ensuring effective service delivery to the citizens.

Rt. Hon Speaker, I wish you my unreserved support and every success in the coming years.
